

Scents Making Sense

When I heard the deliberate. marching steps coming through the leaves, I thought for sure it was another person. For one thing, it was early evening, at least two hours before dusk; for another, friends who hunted the same patch of land had told me that the deer had gone nocturnal. Plus, no one had seen anything better than a six-pointer.

But when I heard the grunts I immediately eased to my feet. Unless another person was walking along, blowing on a grunt tube as a warm up for a kazoo performance, the maker of the scrapes was on his way.

I'd hunted the property for the first time that year on the previous afternoon. Afternoons were best, and the standard modus operandi was to sneak in late afternoon. climb a tree near the edge of the field, and wait for a last-minuteof-daylight deer. The piece of land

was about 80 acres, with no bedding areas, and deer seemed only to trickle through it on the way to farm fields.

But I'd been encouraged by the scrape activity at the edge of the field just inside the woods, where two sizable areas had been thrashed to the mineral soil. I was also eager to try a new product I'd heard about, called MDR 24/Seven granular scents. It's one of those ideas, like camouflage duct tape, that once you hear about it, you wonder why it took so long for someone to do it. Mark Weiser, Pennsylvania, company owner, started out making deer repellants in a granular form. The repellants lasted for nearly a week.

One day it was light bulb time. Why not make a long-lasting deer attractant in the granular form? And he developed MDR 24/Seven scents, which don't evaporate, sink in or freeze. As a matter of fact they were both time release and weatherproof.

It made sense to me. Most hunters try the same old scent technique. They find a good spot with lots of deer sign. When they hunt the area, they use scent to attract more deer. But here is the obvious flaw in that plan - the second you apply that liquid scent, it starts to diminish in potency.

Climb into a tree at 2 p.m., and you might wait for a deer for hours. As the minutes ticks past, the scent continues to evaporate and lessen. By the time a deer checks a scent area, such as a scrape, the effect of the liquid attractant is negligible.

The other problem is that human scent is always left when you walk over and pour the liquid on the ground usually exactly where you expect the buck to stand. Dahhh. Human scent can last up to 24 hours so you get busted when the buck almost gets into position. They have an excellent nose, you know!

With the time releases properties of 24/Seven I could scent it one day and hunt it the next day or two. So I'd juiced the two scrapes with the MDR 24/Seven estrus doe, shaking out the granules from a short distance. The first night I didn' Now it was night number three, and the



deer wasn't the six-pointer. I had not walked over to the scrape for three days but the granules were still working just like that pink bunny. It was a ten-pointer. The buck came in grunting, slightly bristled and headed right for the scrapes. As he passed behind hemlock trees I took a chance and drew.

It was the wrong guess. When he

came out of the hemlocks he was headed straight for me. He walked to a slight knoll and visually checked the field. I was still at full draw, and the constant grunts were frazzling me. I started to shake.

He headed back towards the scrapes and I saw a chance. I did my best deer grunt imitation, which

stopped him, and I shot right over his back. He jumped off and my heart sank but soon, incredibly, I heard the grunts start up again.

I got another arrow on the string. This time the buck went to the far scrape, which I'd ranged at 30 yards. This time I made contact but skipped it over his back. The blood trail was promising at first, but soon clotted and came to an end. I looked hard for two days. I was pretty sure my friends were beginning to doubt my buck description, saying things like, "Are you sure it wasn't the six-pointer?" But weeks later, during a gun-season drive, the big buck again eluded hunters who then wanted to learn more about MDR 24/Seven. The time release granular scent. In a perfect world, the story ends with me getting the deer. Hunting is never a perfect world but I do know "this year he will be bigger and I'll be waiting for him over a 24/Seven scrape.

Time To Sight In Your Gun

The fall hunting season is just a few weeks away, and now is a good time for hunters to sight in their firearms and be sure they are on target when they go afield, according to Paul Johansen, Assistant Chief of Game Management for the WV Division of Natural Resources Wildlife Resources Section.

"Early fall is a pleasant time to visit a shooting range, and public shooting ranges are normally less crowded during this time of year," said Johansen. "I encourage adults to use this time to introduce youngsters to the enjoyment of shooting, and use this opportunity to instruct



them on safe gun handling."

The proper sighting in of a firearm involves the use of a safe shooting range, a solid shooting support and a few basic shooting techniques. A shooting range should have a safe backstop and be at least 500 feet from any residence or place where people gather. DNR maintains many shooting ranges statewide, and these facilities are excellent places to sight in a firearm. The location of these ranges can be found on the DNR Web site at www.wvdnr.gov.

Sighting In Your Firearm While sighting in a firearm, the rifle should be supported solidly

on a sturdy shooting bench using sandbags or a commercial shooting rest. Always place the stock of the firearm, not the barrel, on the rest. Stock and sight mounting screws should be checked for proper tightness. Be sure the ammo is the correct caliber for the firearm, and

sight in with the ammo that will be used for hunting. Several different brands and types of ammo may need to be tested to determine the one best suited for a particular fire-

protection when shooting, and be sure others nearby are also wearing this protection. Try to time your sighting in sessions so the sun is not shining directly into your face or onto your sights. A sandbag placed between the rear of the stock and your shoulder will greatly reduce felt recoil of heavy recoiling firearms. Assume a comfortable shooting position so your muscles are relaxed. Position the firearm's sights on the target by adjusting the rest so the rest holds the firearm on target and little or no support on your part is required.

Relax, take a deep breath, slowly let the breath out about halfway and then smoothly squeeze the trigger with the pad of the shooting finger when the sights are properly aligned on the target. Be careful not to use the joint area of the shooting finger, and do not jerk the trigger in anticipation of the firearm firing. After firing the shot, follow through smoothly and relax before looking at the target or firing another shot.

Fire a three to five shot group, de-


necessary sight adjustments. Fire several more groups, allowing the barrel to cool between groups, and determine if the firearm is properly sighted in. When you are confident that the firearm is properly sighted in, practice shooting several groups from the various unsupported field shooting positions that likely will be used when hunting.

"Going afield with a properly sighted in firearm will enhance your enjoyment of hunting in the Mountain State," Johansen concluded.



Archery In The School Program

The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources Wildlife Resources Section will host its next training for the West Virginia Archery in the Schools Program at the new conference center at Chief Logan State Park on November 28 - 29, 2006, according to Scott Warner, Program Coordinator.

"From the beginning, there has been a tremendous amount of interest from schools located in southern West Virginia to participate in this program," Warner said. "In fact, because of the interest, this will be the second time in less than a year that we'll be hosting a training session in Logan County . A lot of credit needs to be given to the local school officials for their interest in allowing us to bring this program to southern West Virginia ."

DNR personnel implemented this program in the fall of 2004 in 19 schools as part of its pilot program to introduce physical education students to an activity that teaches a life skill. In two years there has been a phenomenal amount of interest with the program growing to 100 schools. Because of the success of this program the DNR was able to host its first State Archery tournament last spring at Capital High School in Charleston . Nearly 300 students from 23 schools from every region of the state participated in the tournament.

DNR officials encourage all schools, especially the ones that are not part of the program, to receive the free training. Teachers in-

terested in attending the training at Chief Logan State Park have until November 10 to sign up. However, due to the type of training and amount of time needed for handson-instructions, classroom size will be limited. Teachers interested in attending this training are en-

couraged to contact the DNR early. Classes typically fill up within a couple weeks.

Youth & Class Q Split Deer Season

A special split deer season for youth and Class Q permit hunters will be held October 28, 2006 and December 25-26, 2006, according to Frank Jezioro, Director of the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources. This season, for the taking of antlerless deer only, will be held on private land in counties or parts thereof open to antlerless (Class N) deer hunting and on 21 specified Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) throughout the state.

Youth hunters, ages 8 through 14, may participate in the special season, but they must be accompanied by a licensed adult at least 21 years of age. The accompanying adult must remain near enough to the youth to render advice and assistance. The adult is not permitted to carry a firearm or bow. Resident youths do not need a license, but nonresident youth must possess a Class XXJ license and a Class CS stamp.

Resident Class Q hunters must possess a valid Class Q permit and a Class A license and CS stamp, or a Class X, XJ, A-L, or AB-L license. Nonresident adult hunters must qualify for, and obtain, a West Virginia Class Q permit along continue to the next page

Small Game Seasons Begin

Hunting for small game in West Virginia will begin October 7 th with the opening of squirrelseason. "Squirrel hunting is very popular with many West Virginia sportsmen. It is a time when hunters can participate in one of their favorite sports and also enjoy the fall beauty of the Mountain State," said Curt is Taylor, Chief of the Division of Natural Resources, Wildlife Resources Section.

Last year's mast production was good, which should have reduced

overwinter mortality and improved reproduction. A recent mast survey, conducted by the Division of Natural Resources (DNR) indicates that statewide oak, hickory, and walnut production this summer was better than the 36 year average. These factors should provide good hunting opportunities for g ray and fox squirrels this fall. Some pre-season scouting to locate areas containing favored foods of squirrels will ensure successful hunting. The daily bag limit for squirrels is six.

The ruffed grouse season opens on October 14 and closes on February 28, 2007. Brood counts for ruffed grouse are near the five-year average but are considerably lower than last year. The majority of the brood counts were from the mountain counties. Soft mast crops are abundant statewide. Grouse hunters should look for areas that provide ample cover and soft mast species such as grape, hawthorn, dogwood, and greenbrier. The daily bag limit for grouse is four.

The hunting season for raccoons will open October 14 at 6:00 p.m. and continues through February 28, 2007. Favorable mast conditions during the last two years have allowed raccoon populations to increase. Mast surveys indicate that food is again plentiful. Hunters, and their hounds, should have a very successful season. Raccoon hunters are reminded that the daily

bag limit is four.

Opening day of cottontail rabbit season is November 4. Rabbit populations should be similar to last year. Old fields and brushy pastures are the best habitat types in which to rabbit hunt. Snowshoe hare, bobwhite quail, ring-necked pheasant, bobcat, red fox, and gray fox hunting seasons also open November 4. Hunters should be aware of daily bag limits and season possession limits for each species.

November 4 marks the opening of trapping season for fur bearing animals in West Virginia . Populations of beaver, bobcat, fox, mink, muskrat, and raccoon are high, and trappers should be very successful. Trappers should be aware of season closing dates for each species.

Hunting Tips

Do you use a decoy? If you use scent along with your decoy don't spray the scent directly on the decoy, but instead place a sponge in a sealed plastic jar with scent applied to it. When hunting simply pull the sponge out of the jar and place it on the ground under the rear portion of the decoy, and when you are through simply place the sponge back in the bottle. Change of scent and sponge are recommended periodically.

Hunting Tip #2

Are the eyes looking dull on your deer mounts? Simply put a portion of Windex on a Qtip and wipe eyes off. This does a very good job on all eyes on taxidermy mounts.

Trappers And Hunters Must Tag Furbearers

Hunters harvesting bobcats, and trappers harvesting bobcats, beaver and fisher must present the whole animal or pelt to an official game checking station or Division of Natural Resources representative within 30 days after the close of the respective season, according to Curtis Taylor, Chief of the Wildlife Resources Section. A tag provided by the checking station shall be attached and remain attached to the whole animal or pelt until it has been sold, tanned or mounted.

Information provided by hunters or trappers on the checking tag is used to monitor the harvest and assist in future management of the different species in West Virginia. Decisions regarding season length, opening and closing dates, and bag limits are reliant upon accurate data obtained from these tags. Hunters and trappers are reminded to consult the 2006-2007 Hunting and Trapping Regulations Summary which is available at all license agents, DNR offices and on the

Fishing With Clarence

"Hey, Herfie! Wanna see a picture of a big largemouth?" I said. The picture was of Clarence with a sixpound plus bass that he'd caught on Stonewall Jackson on our latest trip. Herfie looked at the picture and said, "Ha! I see two big largemouths!" Herfie is short for Herf-Head, an affectionate appellation that Clarence had bestowed on him when he discovered that he had a head harder than a Hereford bull. Clarence and I had tried to recruit Herfie into the fishing ranks but considered it a futile effort when we realized that he wasn't capable of telling a lie. Now who ever heard of a fisherman that didn't stretch things a little?

I was really looking forward to this trip with Clarence to dear ol' Stonewall. The big bass potential is more of a reality on this lake than any in the state, in my opinion. The catch-and-release program has been nothing but great in insuring

a population of lunkers. I figured that I was in for another lesson so I resigned myself to that fact early in the game.

We launched at one of the lesser used ramps and no more trailers were in the lot, good sign or bad sign, who knows? After the "Enterprise" was off the trailer, By J. R. Sarrett I parked the truck and ran back to the ramp like a kid on his first fishing trip. The anticipation is always high on Stonewall and when you're with Clarence it's twofold. He started up his warp drive en-

gine but there would be no multi-G

force acceleration this time, stumps and stick-ups were everywhere. As we were idling downlake, Clarence began his analysis of the situation. "The tributaries are a little low on the pH scale and the barometer is on the ebb. There is no wind so we are devoid of a chop on the water. Water temperature is 72 degrees so I surmise that the majority of the fish will be suspended at the deep dropoffs." I said, "Huh?" Clarence being the kind soul he is began to interpret into Boonese, as he calls it, so I could understand. "The hollers are a little on the sour side and a bad weather spell may be coming. The wind ain't blowing so the fish will be a little deeper

than they normally would, so we gotta fish deep." I say, "Okay!"

That was like priming a pump! The Appalachian diatribe commenced! Jeff Foxworthy would have been green with envy if he could have heard this dialogue. Like I said, laughing a lot is all a part of fishing with Clarence; the guy has a rapier wit and I have been skewered many, many times.

He had been right, this was a day that a bite was hard to find. Occasionally, a small bass or crappie would hit but even they were few and far between. Every once in a while Clarence would open up "Wal-mart" in his many cargo



bays and try something different. I noticed that he used his smallest spinning rod and a plain number six hook. He impaled what looked to me like a small garden slug and started gently casting it into the thickest, weedy, brushy spot on the lake. I watched intently as he started catching bass with this unorthodox combination. They weren't lunkers but they would definitlely

have been keepers in a tournament. Four or five visited his Ranger only to be returned no worse for the wear. I had caught only one bass all day and a few crappie so this entertainment was welcome. He finally depleted this little jungle of all the biters and pulled up the troll motor. On down the lake we went. this looked "bassie" so I rigged up a tube and waited for the short trip to bank and the flop of the troll motor. We stopped about 30 yards from the bank so I made a long cast into the rocks close to shore. This was the most potentially big bass spot we'd fished all day so anticipation was high. I noticed that the "Enterprise" wasn't paralleling the bank, instead she was heading back out into the lake. I turned to Clarence and noticed him intently watching the depth finder. He had a Carolina-rigged Sinko on dragging slowly behind the boat. I thought to myself, "Is he watching soap operas or fishing?" I was getting farther and farther away from the rip-rap and wondering if my big buddy was consumed with boredom. All of a sudden he said, "There it is!" and two seconds later he said, "There He is!" Tree Stand Safety

The leading cause of injury among deer hunters is treestand-related falls. The treestand industry has made considerable progress in this area through educating hunters about the need to always wear a full-body fall restraint harness. When used properly these harnesses can help prevent serous injury, continue to the next page



and could save your life. However, many do not completely addresses some of the chief causes of injury. The Jolt

Falling from a stand, even when wearing a harness is not a pleasant experience. Most harnesses are designed to break your fall, i.e. keep you from reaching the ground should you fall while in your treestand. When hunting however, you need to move around, stand and sit, or change positions to shoot. This requires a certain amount of slack in your harness tether, and a fall of even a foot or two can exert considerable shock to the body.

The situation becomes even more dangerous if you cannot recover (get back into your stand) quickly. Suspension trauma or blood pooling can occur when suspended motionless in a harness for periods of time, which can eventually lead to unconsciousness. Depending on the circumstances, you may have from a few minutes to a half-hour before it's too late. But that's not the worst of it.

The Freefall

Most accidents are not the result of falling directly from a treestand. According to the Kentucky Department of Fish & Wildlife 75 to 80 percent of falls occur while a hunter is in the act of either climbing to or from the stand, or getting into or out of it. This is a much more difficult situation to address.

Hunters using climbing style stands can be reasonably safe if they follow some basic guidelines. Begin by attaching your harness tether to the tree while still at ground level. As you climb, do not detach the tether. Instead, loosen it, move it up, then re-tighten. Similarly, keep it attached, sliding it down as you descend. This will ensure

you are always securely attached to the tree. The situation becomes a bit more problematic when using ladder stands as you cannot keep a conventional harness attached to the tree as you climb. With a hangon style you can use your lineman's style belt and attachment tether to

stay attached.

Fortunately there are products available that address all of these important safety issues. Stop by your local sporting goods store or bow shop. Many stands are available to insure your safety. Hunt safely this bow seasaon.

When photographing animals in the wild, camouflage your equipment as well as yourself. Tape your tripod's legs with camo tape. A camouflage t-shirt works well to cover the camera body and lens and gives you freedom to move your hands underneath.

approach over cover. Always set up your decoy spreads so that the birds can glide in over a safe area such as open water or a bare field. Ducks and geese must land into the wind, which means the wind should be blowing from the decoys toward the open approach area.

Performance Pychology

As I talk to different levels of tournament fishermen around the country, I frequently hear anglers negatively comparing themselves to top competitors. Co-anglers as well as second- and third-tier pros are inclined to make comments like, "I sure wish I could fish crankbaits like David Fritts" or "I'd like to be as confident as Larry Nixon, "cause when he gets a couple of bites in practice, he thinks they were 6-ounders, while I figure my bites were probably bream or drum." These kinds of comments underscore a universal tension in competitors across many sports "the pull between being comfortable with yourself on the one hand and wanting to improve on the other. This month let's take a look at how these apparently competing pressures can work together.

Push-pull

In a number of life domains, and certainly in the world of fishing, we must balance opposing forces in order to be maximally successBy J.T. McNamara

ful. Just recently, round two of the Stren Series tournament on Lake Champlain was canceled due to high winds. The thrill of catching champion-sized smallmouths and the importance of promoting our sport were weighed against the risks associated with competing in potentially unsafe conditions. As you know, Mother Nature won this one.

Similarly, in the psychological battle we wage with ourselves to be top performers, we need to take seriously both sides of the dilemma that is self-acceptance vs. self-improvement.

Hear this: Self-acceptance comes first. We have talked in other articles about how it is important to understand your temperament, your values and your competitive angling strengths and skills. However, let me suggest that if you haven't done so recently you would be wise to do a full psychological inventory.

Here's what I mean.

Dig out your Performance Psychology and Tournament Fishing notebook, the one you have been using since you first started reading these articles (if you don't have one, go to your local discount store and buy a three-subject notebook and label it Performance Psychology and Tournament Fishing). Fill the first page with words, phrases and sentences that describe you. You can use adjectives like competitive, intense, laid-back, intuitive, analytical and the like, or phrases like attentive father, dependable church member, reliable friend, and so forth. Also list your competitive-fishing skills.

Enlist the help of a friend or two, or perhaps a relative or significant other to make your inventory complete. On the first page, focus primarily on the positive facets of your knowledge, skills and characteristics.

Now, turn the page and write down those traits or dimensions where you are not particularly strong, or where you would like to improve. If you recognize the risks associated with being too competitive, for example, put that down.

Perhaps you are not as attentive to your loved ones as you would like to be, so candidly write this in your book. If you have a specific fishing skill you would like to improve, admit it by putting ink on paper. You don' Now set your notebook aside. After a few days, go back and review what you have written about yourself. See if you have painted an accurate picture. Feel free to revise your initial self-evaluation. Once you are satisfied that you have a reasonably full and accurate portrait, you should congratulate yourself on being candidly aware of exactly who and what you are.

Now comes the important part. Looking objectively at both pages, your strengths and your weaknesses, give yourself a pat on the back for being you. While there are a finite number of human talents and characteristics, there are infinite combinations, and clearly there is only one you. All of the worthwhile self-concept/self-confidence theories begin with a foundation of self-acceptance. You have to be able to look yourself in the mirror (or in this case in the notebook) and say something like, "Yep, this is me. I like who I am." After all, this



is what your best friends and closest relatives would say about you, and it is what you would say about them. None of us is perfect, and still we must fundamentally accept and value ourselves and the people around us, in spite of our flaws.



Previous articles in this series on goal-setting, practice schedules, skill improvement and challenging yourself to realize your potential are all worth rereading at this point. Even the best anglers, including the guys we admire like Larry Nixon and David Fritts, never stop learning.

However, at least once a month go back and review your inventory, and refamiliarize yourself with the guy who wears your shirt and drives your boat. He is your best ally, and he needs to be your friend. Emphasize self - acceptance never give up on self-development, and do your best to keep the two in balance. Stay ahead of the crowd.



Bear Lake Angler Access Improvements

The Division of Natural Resources has completed improvements to Bear Lake in Ohio County, making the lake accessible to physically challenged anglers, according to DNR Director Frank Jezioro. An asphalt walkway approximately 1,100 feet long and 8 feet wide was constructed. Two fishing jetties to allow anglers access to deeper water also were built. The parking area was paved with asphalt and parking spaces were designated for the physically challenged. Improvements were also made to the boat launching ramp, and curbs and guard posts were installed.

The improvements were a result of a recommendation from the DNR Physically Challenged Advisory Board. Members of the Board assisted in the design and layout of the new facilities to make them accessible to individuals with physical disabilities.

"Area anglers owe a special thanks to the Physically Challenged Advisory Board for their support of this project" said DNR Director Frank Jezioro. "These improvements not

Sandpiper Wildwood Rockwood that the fishing jetties and walkway will also allow physically challenged hunters the opportunity to hunt waterfowl on the lake.

DNR officials extend thanks to a local contractor, Shawn O'Brien of O'Brien's Rent-All, for his assistance on the construction. O'Brien donated the use of a dozer for site preparation of the improvements.

The total cost of the improvements was approximately \$88,000. Funding for this project came from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses, including the conservation stamp.

Bear Lake is located on the Bear Rocks Lake Wildlife Management Area in Ohio County. Bear Lake is one of four lakes located on the area. These lakes offer good fishing for bass, bluegills and catfish. DNR Wildlife Resources Section personnel stock the lakes with trout in the spring. The lakes are located three miles northeast of Dallas Pike in Ohio County. They are accessible from I-70 by using the Dallas Pike exit, north to county Route 41/3, then county routes 39/4 to 41/6

5 Reasons To Go Squirrel Hunting

Most of my friends are in the field with antlers on their minds. Normally I would have the same outlook during this time of year, but Mom came for a visit and I suddenly reverted to my childhood passion.

My fondest memories are of squirrel hunting with Grandma Daisy, so when Mom got here from Arizona we dusted off the old Browning 22 rifle that Stan gave me for my birthday a few years ago, too many years ago in fact, and headed to the woods. I hate to admit that it had been about 10 years since I went squirrel hunting! The trip reminded me there are plenty of reasons to go squirrel hunting more often!

Reason #1: IT IS FUN. Many of us got introduced to hunting continue to the next page



the pursuit of small game like squirrels and rabbits. We often forget how much fun it was, and still is. Plenty of youth hunts are focused on big game, like deer and turkey, but I often wonder why we don't just take the kids squirrel hunting. Game is plentiful, the weather is pretty good, and the squirrels are challenging quarry, but not so difficult that you come home empty handed more often that not.

Reason # 2: HONE YOUR SKILLS. Sneaking through the woods on a mini-spot and stalk can sharpen your hunting skills. Fine tuning your eyes to the slightest movement, like the flick of a squirrel tail, can get your mind ready to spot the deer you are after, whose only movement might be the flick of an ear. Sometimes the squirrels just sit there in plain sight, but many times you have to creep along silently, using the terrain to hide your movements, just to get in position for a shot. Once in a while you get spotted, receive a severe scolding, and have to wait them out.

Reason # 3: SCOUTING SIDE-BAR: Once in awhile we overlook places where deer may be hiding, traveling or feeding. A rambling squirrel hunt can help you discover new clues that you might not have scouted previously. During our recent trip I found several scrapes and other sign that will help determine new deer stand locations.



Reason # 4: GREAT CUISINE: It had been a few years since I cleaned a squirrel, so our attempts to process the game were a little rusty, but quite functional. We managed to come home with all the re e skillet. One of the squirrels was an old male, so we decided to boil the meat prior to frying. It took two hours of boiling before the meat began to fall away from the bone, but it was worth the extra step. Next we soaked them in milk, rolled them in cracker crumbs and

Want to make tight holding grouse a little more likely to fly? Get a hawk call and blow it periodically. This will cause the pheasants to get nervous and maybe bust out in flight more readily.

Hunting Tips #2

To keep your broadheads from rusting, apply a thin coat of Vase-line petroleum to the blades. To cut down on string slap noise, apply some moleskin to the back face of the bow. The moleskin, plus a string silencer, will keep your bow whisper quiet.

Hunting Tips #3

When muzzleloading always be conscious of the need for a second shot. Have a pre-measured vial of powder, bullet and cap tucked into an accessible pocket. Experienced muzzleloaders can reload in about 30 seconds.

Hunting Tips #4

While a shoulder shot will put most deer down, try behind the shoulder through the ribs. This spoils less meat and makes a good killing shot.

Hunting Tips #5

When you are shopping for a new bow sight with fiber optics, the durability of the fiber-optic pins becomes one of the greatest concerns. You should look for a sight that has the fiber enclosed to prevent damage and breakage.

Hunting Tips #6

Wear rubber boots to reduce ground scent. This will help prevent deer detecting your presence.

TREESTAND SAFETY - Anytime you are in an elevated hunting position you must consider safety. Don't wait until you are in the stand to fasten your safety belt or har-
