



Hunters Helping The Hungry

The Division of Natural Resources (DNR) invites churches around West Virginia to participate this weekend in the Share the Harvest Sunday, according to Jerry Westfall, DNR Coordinator for the Hunters Helping the Hungry (HHH) Program.

Since 1999, the West Virginia Council of Churches and the DNR have sponsored the Share the Harvest Sunday to raise funds for the HHH Program. This year, on Sunday, November 4, approximately 3,000 churches will be asking members of their congregation to contribute \$1 to the HHH Program.

"WVDNR's HHH Program, which began in 1992, has allowed hunters to donate venison to needy West Virginians by dropping-off excess, harvested deer at participating meat processors," said Westfall. "Al-

The Wildlife Resources Section of the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources is sponsoring a Beyond BOW Women's Deer Hunt, December 1-3, 2007 in Lewis County. The registration fee is \$50. Lodging will be provided in Vandalia, West Virginia.

Participants will receive instruction on basic firearms safety, deer hunting techniques and field dressing. There will be a trip to the rifle range to sight in your firearm and for target practice. To participate in this antlerless deer hunt, you must be at least 18 years old and preference will be given to those who have attended a BOW workshop, a BOW hunter safety class, and those who have not attended a previous BOW hunt. Deer Rut Phases

Early Season - Early season is when most archery seasons are in. You will see buck in bachelor groups feeding and traveling together. Buck pay little attention to doe. The doe will still be with their fawns. Deer are feeding heavily getting ready for the rut.

Pre Rut - Pre Rut is when you start seeing scrapes underneath over hanging branches or a buck scent checking a doe to see if she is in estrus. You may also see buck sparing with each other. Buck rubs will start to appear.

Rut - The Rut is when a buck no longer tends his scrapes and you start to see leaves in the scrapes, the buck is now out chasing doe. In different regions of the country most doe in the area will all come into estrus around the same time. This is best described as the Peak of the Rut. You will see bucks chasing does, you could even see more than one buck chasing a doe. You will see bucks doing things they would not normally do like crossing a wide open field in the middle of the day.

Post Rut - Post Rut is when the Rut is over and most of the does have been bred. At this time bucks will go back feeding hard to build their body fat back up to get ready for the up coming winter. This time period is also a time of rest because


Estrous Cycle - This may vary in days but it is usually around 27 to 28 days.





Field Dressing Your Deer

The wind was light, but the air was cold as I walked from my tree stand to where I had hit the big buck with an arrow. I saw the arrow go through the animal's body and knew it was a good solid hit the minute I released. Most bow hunters have the feel of a good shot or of a bad one, you just know if the arrow was released properly and you know if your form was good as well. In this case, I knew I would soon have meat on the table.

I had stayed in my stand for about thirty minutes after making my shot to allow the animal to bleed a bit and to stiffen up. I knew from experience the animal would not go very far, unless pursued. I had learned a long time ago that a hurt animal would, in most cases, simply find a place to bed down, so I had relaxed and waited. I have seen many hunters pursue deer for miles and wonder how the animal could keep moving, but never underestimate the power of adrenaline.

My arrow was found near the spot where the deer had been standing when I released it. It had passed through the deer and was stuck in the ground. The shaft was covered in blood and there was a blood trail, as well as clear tracks, leading toward a cluster of trees about fifty yards away. I notched another arrow and slowly followed the tracks and blood trail. I didn't have to go very far into the trees when I saw the deer lying near a large pine. I approached the downed animal from the rear and was ready to take another shot if need be (even an injured deer can be dangerous to an unprepared hunter). Never assume your deer, even if it is down and on the ground, is safe to approach.

If you approach from the rear the deer will hear you and if possible it will raise its head to look in your direction, it may even attempt to stand. In either case, you will have enough time to place another arrow or bullet into the animal for safeties sake. The deer I had hit on this hunt was dead.

I quickly prepared the deer tag as required by my state and placed it




on the bucks rack. I tied in on the lower part of the rack so it would not slide off when I transported the deer back to camp. The exciting part of the hunt was over, now came the work. I moved the deer so its head was uphill slightly and then cut its throat, see illustration step 1. (I have heard different arguments about the importance or need of this step, both pro and con, but old habits are hard to break).

Before I started field dressing

the animal, I removed one of my one quart canteens (I always carry two) and unscrewed the lid. I also pulled an old bath towel from my fanny pack and placed it down beside my water. Reaching deeper in my back I pulled out a poncho and some nylon cord (550 cord from a parachute is what I usually carry). I made sure all of my gear was out and ready for use before I did anything else. I hate to look for some-

thing in my pack when my hands are covered with blood. Some folks may want to use patient examination gloves like a doctor uses, but I don't. There are also latex gloves that can be used (they don't leave a residue on the meat) or the surgical gloves. Rubber gloves are strongly recommended by the Center for Disease Control in areas with endemic chronic wasting disease (CWD). I don't like the feel of gloves when I field dress game (and CWD is not a hazard in my area), so I prefer not to wear them. If you are unsure if CWD is a problem in your area, contact your local fish and game agency. Just be sure to follow any safety suggestions from your state agency to avoid illness.

If the weather had been very cold I would have made a fire and got comfortable as I field dressed the animal, but there was no need that morning. I have found in cold weather the animal is harder to work because it starts to first stiffen and then freeze in the cold. And, I usually do my field dressing with a very small skinning knife. Those "Rambo" blades may look good, but they are hardly practical for field dressing large game. I want to be able to "feel the blade" as I use it and know I am not cutting a major organ or contaminating the meat. A small knife works just fine for me. And, keep the knife sharp.

I started by making a circular cut

completely around an area just above four knee joints, see illustration step 2. Then, at the sex organs, I circled them with the knife blade and removed them, see illustration step 3. While I was in that area of the buck, I also made a deep circular cut around the rectum (using caution not to cut through the intestines or making any punctures of the rectum). I pulled, and many of you may disagree with this step, the rectum out and tied it tightly closed with a piece of my nylon cord. I think this step prevents leakage or making a nasty mess where I am working dressing my game.

As avid worldwide hunters of many diverse game animals, there have been many occasions that the intended prey got away because they picked up our presence simply by their extraordinary sense of smell. Be it whitetails, elk, bear (Black, Grizzly and Brown), cape buffalo or the bison to a whole myriad of game in between from all around the globe, we have been flat busted and many more times then we like to admit. As a matter of fact, one of us single handedly disbanded a herd of 70 plus Persian Ibex without them ever seeing me. But as we write this, we like to think that it happens to everyone else just as frequently and it is not

ing for weeks on end despite daily vigorous physical activity. That scenario makes for a truly memorable olfactory experience. Now on some hunts, scent and odor control are not nearly as crucial as others, especially for the firearm hunter but it is usually very important for the archer. So let's look at the science behind us smelly humans.

First of all let's get rid of the easy part of this, the aspect of SCENT. All species have a unique scent to them, humans included and that is why you know a horse is around without seeing it. Dogs smell like dogs and not elephants. Deer smell like deer and not pigs and so on. This unique scent is really not an odor, it is what we as a species emanate. This is our natural smell and at this point can not be eliminated via present day technology.

WV DNR Announces Awards

The Sportsperson of the Year and Sportsmen's Organization of the Year for 2007 were announced by West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (DNR) Director Frank Jezioro during the recent West Virginia Celebration of National Hunting and Fishing Days at Stonewall Resort State Park.

Because of the extraordinary contributions of two individuals to West Virginia natural resources and the sporting public, the Director decided to award two separate 2007 Sportsperson of the Year Awards.

The first award was given to Joe Crowder of Elkview, who is currently the stocking coordinator for the Kanawha Valley Chapter of Trout Unlimited (KVCTU). He has planned, supervised and participated in numerous stocking efforts over the years with KVCTU, contributing not only his time but also his personal gear, gasoline and vehicle wear and tear. In 2006 alone, he contributed to the stocking of 80,000 brown trout fingerlings in 18 streams – 3 of which were devoid of trout. Also, in April 2006, he presided over KVCTU's stocking of its one millionth fingerling.

He is head of KVCTU's Stream

Chemistry Program, Save-Our-Streams Program and outreach programs. He has collected data on more than 130 streams, contributing significantly to regional stream monitoring efforts. He has assisted watershed associations monitor water quality, complete stream bank restoration and develop a community park. "His positive interactions with landowners have opened previously closed streams to the fishing public. He has a great rapport with kids, teaching them not only how to fish and tie spinners, but also how to understand, appreciate and respect the natural world," said Frank Jezioro.

The second 2007 Sportsperson of the Year Award was given to Randy Benear of Cross Lanes, who has been a member of DNR's Physically Challenged Advisory Board

Scent Tips From Tink's

Always wear rubber boots. If you wear leather boots always use a boot pad or drag rag with Tink's® Red Fox-P on it to help cover your tracks.

When bowhunting and using deer lure always place your lure in an area that you can shoot and at a shot distance that is comfortable to you.

If you see deer going down wind of you're hunting location start misting a deer lure with the wind. You want the lure to mix with your scent; hopefully this will confuse the deer enough not to spook.

using cover scents and deer lures. Scent Bombs can be hung up to get more scent into the air and bowhunters can use the orange container as a yardage marker.

In windy, cold or wet weather try using a gel lure like Tink's® # 69 DOE IN RUT Gel. Gel works better under these conditions. Wind does not dry out the gel as fast, does not freeze as fast and with gel it will last longer in the rain.

Remember a deer's nose is their #1 defense. You can have the best lure in the world even a real doe but if he smells you he's gone. Deer lures can and do work but please keep in

mind they are not magic; nothing beats good old fashion scouting.

Always use an odor eliminator like Tink's® Odor Lock to help reduce human and unnatural odors. Use before and during your hunt, just mist clothing and also the inside and outside of your hunting hat.

Deer Hunting Strategy

The best deer hunting tips are the ones that you figure out for yourself and can offer to others. After all, few things feel better than finding the way that works for you. Of course, until you reach that point, here are some deer hunting tips to help you get there.

Deer Hunting Tips:

- · Deer are generally crepuscular: they are often active at dawn and dusk and sleep during the middle of the day and night.
- · This does not, however, mean that you will not see them feeding during the middle of the day.
- · Bucks are more often during hunting seas
- · Go scouting. Do this during early to late summer. When you scout, be as careful as if you are actually hunting. Stay quite and do not leave much scent.
- · Find the food source that the deer will be eating during the hunting season.
- · Look for trees that will have the

most acorns.

- · Look for areas with greens like clover or rye covering the ground.
- · Look for deer trail routes. The ones with the freshest tracks are the best.
- · If you are going to set up any sort of hunting stand, be sure to set it up pre-season, before the deer start feeding in that area. Otherwise, you can scare them off.
- · Mark your "hot spots" on a GPS.
- · Also be sure to take lots of notes. Do not expect to simply remember everything. You want to write down everything that you find.
- · You can find where the bucks are if you scout during the pre-season, right after the bucks have rubbed the velvet from their antlers. During this time, the rut (mating seacontinue to the next page

on) a buck is going to leave more markings on trees than he will afterward.

- · Look for areas with thick and dense brush. It is in areas like this that deer like to sleep. You can set up on the outskirts of such an area... somewhere where you will be able to see better.
- · Remain still! Do not move unless absolutely necessary!
- · Do not fall asleep! This can be tricky when you remain so still, but falling asleep not only will lose you your deer, but it can also be quite dangerous if you are up in a tree stand.
- · Use special products to mask your scent. Deer have an excellent sense of smell.
- · Keep the wind direction in mind. Stay downwind of whatever feeding or sleeping spot, etc. you are

- "staking out." Constantly check for changes in the wind.
- · Wear a harness if using a tree stand.
- · Move the site of your tree stand around. You do not want your deer to start associating deer stands with humans!
- · Try to avoid walking a long a deer trail or even walk parallel to one. Take the back route... walk up streams, etc.
- · Be sure to always be ready. Make sure that you have checked your equipment right when you get to

the stand, not once a deer is already out!

• The majority of deer are shot downwind from a food source.



Tag Furbearers

Trappers harvesting beaver and fisher are reminded they must present the whole animal or pelt to a game checking station or DNR representative within 30 days after the close of the respective season. A tag provided by the checking station shall be attached to the whole animal or pelt until it has been sold, tanned, or mounted.

A recent law change now requires bobcat hunters and trappers to field tag each bobcat before moving the animal from the location where it was killed. The field tag must remain on the carcass until it is retagged with an official game checking tag at an official game checking station. Hunters and trappers are to



Reel Chat With Steve Clapper

Welcome to FLW Live Reel Chat. We're joined by FLW Tour pro Steve Clapper of Lima, Ohio. As a longtime Lake Erie fishing expert, Clapper has raked in honor after honor in Stren Series and BFL competition over the years, winning seven events and logging an astounding 31 top-10 finishes in FLW Outdoors related events over the course of his career.

Clapper's crowning achievment came July 15 when he won the Chevy Open at the Detroit River/Lake Erie, adding yet another win and top-10 appearance to his resume. Not only did he win the first FLW Tour event he ever entered, but he managed to nearly triple his career earnings with FLW Outdoors after taking home the \$200,000 first-place prize from the Chevy Open. Steve Clapper is here to take questions from you, the fans. Let's get started.

Q: First off, congrats on the win! What a thrill! When searching for new spots on Erie, how do you

go about finding them -- looking at maps and finding breaklines or just time on the water cruising and looking at your electronics? Thank you!

-- Justin Miller (Marshall, Mich.)

A: Really, when you go looking, it helps to have a calm day when you're not in 4- or 5-footers, where you can read the bottom effectively. I usually pick a spawning area, and you know that after they spawn they're going to move to deeper water. Every year I just keep following them out further and further. On big lakes like Erie, you're catching fish in over 30 feet of water in the summer. Years back in a Stren event in Buffalo, N.Y., I was catching bass in 43 feet of water. In that case, there was a shoal, and we kept moving out and moving out, and we just kept finding fish. The mapping GPS systems we have today are unbelievable, so electronics really help as well.

Q: First off, great job on your first FLW victory last week! Drop-shot-

ting is big on Erie. Can you explain how you used this technique in deep, rough waters like you fished last week? Thank you.

-- Brian Threet (Ann Arbor, Mich.)
A: That's a good question, because it's tough to drop-shot in rough water. I was marking my rock piles with a buoy. I just make little continue to the next page

pitches, no more than a 45-degree angle. As it got rougher, especially on the third day of the tourney, where we had 7-footers, I picked up a tube with a 3/4-ounce head, and that seemed to be the ticket -- much more so than the drop-shot. That was probably my biggest asset that day -- that tube. It was just so much easier to work with that heavier head and cast away from the boat. I just had more flexibility with the tube in the wind. However, it seems like when fish move into summer haunts, the drop-shot is king, in my estimation.

Q: When using the drop-shot, how do you select which bait you will use?

-- Seth (Wixom, Mich.)

A: Well, there are like three baits I like: a Poor Boy's goby, Berkley Gulp baits and Roboworms. But the goby and the Gulp have been my two favorite baits for drop-shotting. Also, I have to say, the way the scent works on those Berk-


ley Gulp baits is amazing -- I can't tell you how much of a difference they have made on the fishing the last couple of years, especially on Lake Erie. Overall, I had four dropshot rods rigged up during my last FLW tourney, with a different bait on each one. I also made up about 10 special leaders ahead of time for my drop-shot hook, because it's not something you want to waste your time with during tournament hours.

Q: Steve, congrats on the FLW Lake Erie win; no one that fishes Erie deserves it more than you. I am newer to running a bass boat on Lake Erie, and I was curious about how you run the bigger waves - 5 to 7-plus feet - with a bass boat. I never know when you are supposed to quarter them, run the troughs, or go against them or with them. Also, what do you suggest for a newer




boater to have as far as a setup for Lake Erie (prop, tie-down equipment, etc.)? Thanks, and congrats again.

-- Travis (Harrod, Ohio)

A: As far as equipment goes, a good five-blade prop is very important. They have adapter kits for them as well, to customize them to your own boat. If you notice on Lake Erie, most of the guys run a five-blade prop. You also need straps that go around the trolling motor bracket that go right around the shaft and Velcro down. On the bracket, where it meets the furtherst point back in the boat, I attach a ram mount. In bad weather, it really holds it secure. It's critical.

I've seen too many new fishermen who run too hard and break all of their equipment. I also like to carry a VHF radio and a cell phone for safety purposes. As far as boat control goes, in high waves, I want to keep the nose of my boat in the air and just meander along. You don't want to be in a hurry, because that will get you in trouble in high waves. The main thing for a newcomer is to go out at first with somebody who has experience, because you might not encounter any rough water your first trip or two. I've seen a lot of people out there who really didn't know what they're getting into. Start out close, know your boat well and gain experience. Because when that wind kicks up, most people have never seen anything like it before.

Q: What fish-finder unit are you using? Have you seen Humming-bird's 987c side finder, and if so,

what do think of its technology?
-- Brian Feutz (Ada, Mich.)

A: I use a Lowrance 104c on the console, and I have an X15 MT on the front of my boat. Both units are equipped with their own GPS module. The new technology that Hummingbird has come out with is supposed to be phenomenal as well. Personally, I haven't seen it yet myself, but from what I've been told, the new technology sounds interesting.

Q: How big of an impact has the population explosion of gobies had on Lake Erie fishing? Have you retooled your approach at all in response to the presence of that baitfish?

-- Jon Tourant (Sandusky, Ohio)

A: The introduction of the goby has been monumental in the whole life cycle, I believe, of smallmouth bass. Once they were introduced, they grew immensely throughout the lake. But it's actually turned out to be an unbelievable forage fish for smallmouth, and as such, smallmouth bass have gotten a lot bigger. They've also drawn the smallmouth into deeper water, as gobies will be at a lot of different and deeper depths than most other

baitfish. Also, with the introduction of zebra mussels, a lot of the crayfish population has disappeared off of the shallow rocks because the mussels are covering everything. I think this has also pushed the smallmouth into deeper water.

ustain the level of quality smallmouths with the amount of tournaments being held on its waters?

- -- Duane Bethke (Pinckney, Mich.) A: That's a good question. I guess the short answer is, I hope so. The anglers are taking a lot better care of their fish, and there's just been a higher level of special care, especially with the new equipment, holding tanks, etc.
- Q: Steve, great job in Detroit. What would be the first area you would look for on the Detroit River to find fish if you were unable to fish the lake?
- -- Mike (Cleveland, Ohio)

A: The first area I'd look for is the area as close to the lake as I could get. I'm not really good on the river, but there is great fishing on the river. One of the things I'd look for is where the current is running up hard against a bulkhead or a dock. Those are prime feeding spots for

smallmouths. I'd also look for flats and the eddies. If I'm forced to fish the river, I'm definitely looking for that current up against those bulkheads.

Q: Do you prefer different colors (baits) for different water conditions or water clarity?


-- Joe (Grand Rapids, Mich.)

A: That's a real good question. As far as the drop-shot, I've found that a green-pumpkin goby with black and purple fleck is the first bait I'll put on in stained water. For clear water, I'll go more toward a lighter, natural goby color. And I'd do the same, pretty much, for a tube bait. You can't go wrong on Lake Erie with a watermelon color of some sort.

Q: Steve, congratulations on the win! I hope you don't spend the money too fast! Anyway, do you treat Lake Erie as one big lake, or do you treat it as several different lakes in one and just concentrate on one area, breaking it down like you would a normal-size lake?

-- Jonathan (Charlotte, N.C.)

A: I guess I just treat it as one big area. If I go there and start practicing, I kind of have a circuit I need to go check. When I make the rounds on a practice day, I'll probably run 120 miles, making a loop, checking spots. It's as simple as seeing who is home and who is not. Understanding how the the currents work in the lake is important as well, which continue to the next page

s mostly determined by the wind. I really like to bring my bait in the same direction as it would naturally flow with the current. During this past tournament, the fish were in transition. So we'd pull up on those summertime haunts and catch one good fish, maybe two. That was the norm. I realized the fish had just not migrated yet. Once you get into the August, deep-water structure fishing on Erie, it can be the highlight of the summer.

Q: Congrats on your win. I was hoping a local guy would take the trophy. I was wondering if you had a special way of fishing on a dead flat day. Are there certain retrieves or lures that are more effective in these conditions? Catching fish on Erie is more difficult for me when it is supercalm.

-- Ryan Miller

A: That's a great question. The last day of the FLW Tour event on Lake Erie, the day went flat and I wasn't getting any bites. When we started out in the morning, we had a nice little chop and it was pretty good fishing. But when it's calm, it can be tough fishing on Erie -- you hear it all the time. When it is flat, I like to put a 3/4-ounce Big Dude made by Bite Me Jigs. By having

three casts and landed a 4-pounder right away. I hooked two fish in about 20 minutes that way. The finesse techniques had worn off, and had I not had that technique at my disposal -- triggering a fish into biting -- I wouldn't have been as successful.


