Gobblers By Bow

Spring turkey season opens soon and there is no better time than now to begin a quest to bag a gobbler with a bow. Although bowhunting for turkey is difficult and can be very frustrating at times, it is highly exciting and very rewarding when successful.

Bowhunting turkeys, as with most all types of hunting, is a lifelong learning experience. There are so many nuances and variables; one can only continue to learn through experience and tenure in the pursuit. Here is a look at three of the key elements to consider when bowhunting spring gobblers

Method

Bowhunters have basically the same two options of methods as do gun hunters. They are call and move or ambush. Either technique will work, although the latter method requires much more patience.

However, the ambush method is much less strenuous for the elderly and those who may be mobility impaired.

The ambush method basically revolves around good pre-hunt scouting. The hunter must know the area being hunted and the habits of the local birds. The scouting information must be current. Knowing where the birds were and what they were doing three weeks before the hunt may be of little use after such a lapse of time.

After scouting and locating a pattern of area birds, the hunter erects a well-hidden blind alongside a travel path, feeding location, or strutting zone. Then the wait becontinue to the next page

gins. Some hunters will patiently spend entire days in the field awaiting their chance at a passing gobbler.

Comfort in the blind is essential if one is to spend much time there. A good seat and plenty of room to move and draw the bow is needed. Bringing along something to eat and drink can also help one remain in place longer.

The more traditional method of turkey hunting, which is calling and moving to locate a gobbler, is an exciting way to bowhunt. The hunter uses all the same tactics as would a shotgun hunter, but must pack along a blind or camouflaging material which is light enough to carry and quick to erect.

The hunter moves and calls until a gobbler is located. Once located, the bowhunter must move

as close as possible and try to call the bird in for a shot. However, depending on the type of blind being used, bowhunters may not be able to move in as close on the bird as can gun hunters.

The bowhunter must take the time it takes to erect the blind into consideration. Hunters must think quickly and logically to choose the best spot to be both concealed and have an opportunity for a shot at the approaching tom.

Concealment

Any turkey hunter knows that being well-hidden is of utmost importance to be successful. This is exponentially true for bowhunters because of so much more movement being required to draw the bow. The hardest part of bowhunting turkeys is not the shot, but getting drawn to even attempt a shot.

It is almost a necessity to have some type of blind or camouflage netting to conceal the bowhunter from the keen eyesight of the quarry. It's not impossible to hide amongst the natural foliage and still pull off a shot, but the odds are much more continue to the next page

favorable with some type of blind. Pop-up types of blinds have become very popular during the last few years. Advances in materials and technology now allows bowhunters to carry a blind which is lightweight, quick to erect, and offers great concealment. However, not all blinds are created equally. Bowhunters need to actually "testdrive" a blind before purchase. Acquiring one through mail order without ever seeing it up close could be a costly mistake. Hunters need to actually get inside of a blind and inspect it for comfort and usability based on their physical size and shooting method. Not all hunters are the same physical size and some blinds will be more accommodating than others. Set-up



tom arrives. Improper placement will result in a very unsatisfactory experience.

Hunters have to take many things into consideration when picking the spot for the blind. Will the blind blend with the surrounding foliage or appear unnatural and suspicious? What are all the possible travel routes the turkey may take when approaching? Are there enough clear shooting lanes? All this information must be processed quickly and correctly.

Choosing the set-up for an ambush type of hunt is not as stressful, but no less important. The bowhunter still must take all the same criteria into consideration. Concealment, blending, approach paths, and shooting lanes are all still factors to consider. However, the ambush hunter has more time to select a location and manipulate the surrounding brush and foliage to better conceal the blind.

Summary

Spring bowhunting for turkeys can sometimes consist of a lot of trial and error. Nonetheless, it is a very exciting and rewarding experience for bowhunters. A bowbagged spring gobbler is a true trophy for any arrow-slinger.





Spring Has Sprung

By all accounts, we have made it out of the other side. To clarify that last statement, I believe that now we can safely say thataing is here, and not a day too soon! Just last weekend, I heard the "peepers" singing as I drove by a swampy area, and coincidentally, robins are arriving daily to confirm that spring is here. Sure, by the calendar, we are still technically in winter, however, mother nature is turning up the heat with that, both hunters and fishermen alike are eagerly getting ready for the spring seasons!

When I thing of spring, I thing of trout fishing, bass fishing, ramp digging, camping, bicycling, nature walks and most importantly.... turkey hunting! I love everything associated with spring,

and in viewing the extended fore-cast, this spring should develop gradually and all of the seasons should be right on schedule. I have already heard numerous reports from trout fisherman who state that the ice is already mostly gone in the high mountain streams, and the trout stocking programs is already in high gear. Just last weekend, I drove through the mountains

around Glady Creek and witness firsthand the number of trout fishermen who were out in force in pursuit the rainbows, browns and brook trout freshly stocked in the streams. In addition to the trout fishermen, dozens of folks were out walking the trails, or bicycling around the campground, which appeared to be full of tent campers.



As we drove around Sully Road, and down to the lower Dry Fork, we witnessed the same amount of activity there as well.

On another note, the gobblers have started gobbling already. though we are still over a month away from the start of the spring gobbler season, the turkeys are in spring mode as well. In the few times that I have been out in the woods, turkey sign seemed to be pretty common, so it appears that the winter was not too hard on the turkey population. I'm sure that they are plenty of two, and three year old birds out there to test the calling skills of the turkey hunters come April.

On another of my outdoor excursions, I found myself on the Tygart River at Arden, and decided go down by the stream to test the waters' temperature. I was surprised to see my thermometer read 51 degrees! I had expected to see water in the 40's, but no, it was already warmed to the point that spring spawn is just around the corner for the Tygart smallmouths. Typically, river fish spawn when the temperature gets into the upper 50's, and will aggressively take baits during the prespawn mode. By my records, they should be in that mode now! With that type of condition in the river, Tygart Lake will also be in the 50's, and should be ripe continue to the next page



Venison is collected and distributed by Mountaineer Food Bank (Gassaway) and Huntington Area Food Bank. 

Disease In WV Bats

The U.S. Geological Survey National Wildlife Health Laboratory in Madison, Wisconsin, has confirmed that bats from two Pendleton County caves submitted for testing by Division of Natural Resources wildlife biologists have the condition known as White-nose Syndrome (WNS). This condition has killed thousands of cave bats in the Northeast, and the affected sites in West Virginia are currently the southernmost sites where WNS has been observed.

White-nose Syndrome is named for the white fungus which is ofcontinue to the next page







ten observed on the muzzles, wings and ears of affected bats. Although there may be several factors contributing to the condition known as White-nose Syndrome, the invasion of skin cells by a specific fungus is a consistent observation in all cases. The fungus, a member of the genus Geomyces, was cultured from the West Virginia bats. Genetic data indicate the fungus is identical to that cultured for other WNS-positive bats. Microscopic examination of the bats' skin provided evidence that the fungi had invaded the cells of the skin in all three species submitted: little brown bats, eastern pipistrelles, and northern long-eared bats.

"This winter, DNR biologists have conducted bat surveys in Grant, Hardy, Randolph and Tucker counties as well as Pendleton County," said DNR biologist Craig Stihler. "To date, WNS has only been observed in Pendleton County. However, only a small number of caves have been visited in each county."

It seems likely that the most common way this condition is spread is from bat to bat. However, because the fungus associated with WNS can live in cave soils, it may be possible for cavers to spread WNS in cave dirt on their clothing and gear. DNR Wildlife Resources biologists ask cavers to clean and disinfect all gear between caving trips both within the state and between states. Guidelines for disinfecting gear and additional information on white-nose syndrome can be found on the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Web site www.fws.gov/northeast/white_nose.html. Cavers are also asked to avoid entering some

"Scientists at several laboratories across the country are looking for ways to fight WNS. This research will take time," Stihler said. "Our best conservation strategy is to do whatever we can to slow the spread of WNS until a better solution is







Hunters Record For Black Bear

West Virginia hunters harvested a record 2,064 black bears during the combined 2008 archery and firearms seasons, according to Chris Ryan, Black Bear Project Leader for the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources. The preliminary harvest data for the combined seasons in 2008 was 14 percent higher than the previous record of 1,804 established in 2007.

"Numerous factors contributed to this record bear harvest," said Ryan. "West Virginia has a tremendous bear population that allows for a variety of different hunting opportunities. The expansion and increase in the bear population has led to the extension of hunting seasons designed to keep counties in line with their management objectives. With the cooperation of hunters, wildlife managers can maintain and/or adjust bear populations to desired management levels by implementing appropriate hunting regulations."

Hunters took 477 bears during the 2008 archery season. The top five counties were Randolph (56), Nicholas (37), Preston (36), Webster (32), and McDowell (24).

Firearms hunters took a record

harvest of 1,587 bears during 2008. Hunters took 670 bears during the September season. Top five counties were Pendleton (72), Randolph (66), Hardy (62), Pocahontas (60) and Greenbrier (52). Hunters took 109 bears during the concurrent buck gun season. Top five counties were Kanawha (32), Raleigh (27), Boone (25), Fayette (24) and Monongalia (1). Hunters took 808 during the traditional December season. The top five counties were Pocahontas (128), Greenbrier (105), Pendleton (102), Randolph (76), and Webster (68).

Interactive Trout Stream Map

Trout anglers now have a new interactive tool at their fingertips to help them locate a stream stocked with trout, according to West Virginia Division of Natural Resources Director Frank Jezioro. An avid trout angler himself, Jezioro says this program provides all the information needed to plan a fishing trip.

The information can be found by going to the DNR home page at www.wvdnr.gov, then looking under the "Fishing" heading and clicking on "Trout Stream Map."

Once on the Web site, you can search the state by specific stream or lake, by county, or by city. You can narrow down the search if you iust want to find catch-and-release or fly-fishing-only areas. Once you locate the stream you will find information on stocking frequency, description of the stocked section of stream, and driving directions from major highways. Using the state map on the Web site, you can zoom in or out to access a more detailed map which uses aerial photography. You can also move easily from one section to adjacent areas using the panning tool. In addition, the map identifies public fishing access sites.

The map opens a new window to allow you to easily go back to the DNR home page. You can also use the links at the top of the map page to quickly access the daily trout stocking report, fishing regulations, or buy a fishing license.

"This online map demonstrates the capabilities of our staff," Jezioro said. "We have very talented folks who work hard to provide the public with useful information that allows them to take advantage of the abundant natural resources our



Spinner Bait Basics

Spinnerbaits are often referred to as "the most versatile" lure because they can be fished in nearly any condition, year 'round. They can be fished in winter, summer, fall, spring, hot water, cold water, muddy water and even clear water; from just under the surface to as deep as you want to fish it. It also is the type of lure that can be fished in, over, through and around many forms of cover.

Spinnerbaits used to be called "safety-pin" lures, because their shape resembles that of an open safety pin. A lead head of varying weight is combined with a wire framework, sharp hook and one or more flashing spinner blades. A soft-rubber, plastic, silicone or "lumaflex" skirt is added to cover the hook. The spinnerbait has a smooth, flowing action that mimics a swimming baitfish. The blades vibrate and flash, attracting the attention of bass. You can use spinnerbaits in most bass-fishing situations, but they are especially suited to fishing shallow cover. The most popular sizes range between 1/4-ounce and 3/4-ounce.

Spinnerbait Designs

Short-arm:

The length of the top wire arm is shortened. Can be fished anywhere but is especially suitable to dropping or "helicoptering" off ledges. Long-arm:

The length of the top wire arm

is lengthened. Can be fished anywhere but is especially suitable to grass or brushy cover.

Twinspins:

Work best on the bottom or as a drop-bait.

Techniques

against structure. They usually should be fished at a slow to medium retrieve. Use 14 pound test line or better on a baitcasting reel and medium action rod. A heavy, worm-type rod often causes you to overreact when a strike occurs pulling the lure from the mouth of the bass. After the lure enters the water, give it a little "pop" to get the blades moving. Always fish the spinnerbait near the surface (close enough so you can see it). If you have to catch fish with it out of site, there's a better bait to use (such as a worm). Note what you were doing when a bass hits - then try to duplicate it. A fast retrieve, in which the lure remains high and in sight in

murky water, often produces well on feeding fish.

The best advice for fishing with spinnerbaits is to experiment with many different styles of retrieve. No single method works all of the time. On any given day, you should switch around with your retrieve until you find something that works. Stick with it until it ceases to work, and then go on to another method.

Experiment with these different retrieves:

Contact Wake Buzz Helicopter Slow-Roll

Blades

Not sure which blades to use? Use these guidelines:

Single Blade:

Single blade designs often produce better in deeper, clearer water, or when fish aren't actively feeding. In cold water, use blades that create the most water resistance because this allows a slower presentation. For low light conditions, and in heavily stained water, use single blades for more vibration. In real muddy water, use a 1/2 ounce bait with a big blade.

Tandem Blade:

Tandem blade spinnerbaits often work best in murky water or when fishing grass or thick cover. For more flash, use tandem blades (use two different colored blades). In visibility of 2 feet or more, use a 1/4 ounce bait with tandem willow-leaf blades.

Colorado:



Use Colorado blades for bass in early prespawn, for pressured bass, and for sluggish bass in shallow water. They produce the most vibration making them ideal for fishing deep, in murky water, or at night.

Indiana:

Looking much like a pear, these blades fall between Colorado and willowleaf blades. This shape adds flash and decreases vibration. They continue to the next page

can be fished faster than Colorado blades, making them better suited for active bass in stained to clear water.

Willowleaf:

For vegetation, willow blades are best. Their long, thin profile makes them snag-resistant and weed-resistant. They create a lot of flash,

which imitates a baitfish. If everybody is using willowleaf blades, use a different blade to give the fish a different look.

Blade Colors:

Most fishermen begin with silver blades in clear water and gold or copper blades in murky water. Clear water and shallow fish may require a switch to white blades to reduce flash. Or try plastic blades with a hint of metal flake. Use colored blades for smallmouths, especially chartreuse or white - even in crystal clear water.

You can use large blades with a small (1/4 ounce) bait and small blades with large (1/2 ounce or larger) baits. For example: In windy conditions when the forage is small baitfish, use a 1/2 ounce bait (to throw against the wind) with small blades (to match the forage). Use large blades on small baits to give it a slow fall.

The blades should run directly above the hook. If they're not, bend

the wire until they do.

Tips

- Always cast underhand for the best presentation.
- Spinnerbaits should be among the first baits you use in the spring. They are especially well-suited to cold water. They also work well in warm, murky water.
- A little red somewhere on the spinnerbait usually is an asset.
- Spinnerbaits are excellent night-fishing lures. Use a contrasting dark-colored skirt at night such as black and purple, red and black, etc.
- For daytime fishing, light colors such as white and chartreuse often work best.
- Add a trailer of plastic or pork to a spinnerbait for more appeal, more buoyancy, and greater lift.

- Add a trailer hook to the spinnerbait's hook to catch short-striking fish.
- If the terrain will permit, reverse the trailer hook for an even better strike-catch ratio.
- Get spare spinnerbait skirts and blades and experiment with various colors, sizes and blade shapes without having to buy many different lures.
- Experiment with bright, gaudy colors. Sometimes bass will annihilate them.
- Whenever you detect a pause in the beat of a blade, set the hook.
- Don't scrimp on spinnerbaits. Buy the best you can. Quality spinnerbaits use ball bearing swivels and high quality hooks.
- Try casting onto the shore and gently pulling the lure into the water for a quieter presentation.
- When on the hunt for tackle do not forget your local bait shops. Often times they will stock items more suited for the surrounding waterways. Larger chain stores often have a selection that is not matched for local waters but for ease of restocking multiple stores. Tackle shop owners have a better working knowledge of the area and a desire to stock and sell items that work. They also help to ensure a strong fishing community by spon-

soring/organizing tournaments and clubs. Another important point is that most chain stores do not offer live bait. If you go to Wal-Mart every time you need some tackle then the next time you head to your bait shop it may not be there. Do not underestimate how important your business is to these local shop owners. -

• When fishing in a small river that is shallow, use a 1/4-ounce. white Rooster Tail near brush piles. Let the bait fall close to the rocks and retrieve slowly. This is a good hint for catching big smallmouth bass.





Time To Put Up **Hummingbird Feeders**


The return of spring also means the return of the ruby-throated hummingbird to West Virginia and time to put up your hummingbird feeders, according to Rob Tallman of the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources' Wildlife Resources Section.

The ruby-throated hummingbird is the only hummingbird to breed east of the Mississippi River, although rarely, other species are seen in the Mountain State. This bird occurs throughout the state in mixed woodlands, orchards and backyard habitats with much open land and blooming flowers nearby.

"Hummingbirds feed on nectar with a long, brush-like tongue. They also consume tiny insects and spiders. Because of the hummingbirds' fondness for nectar, they can easily be attracted to your backyard by feeders or plantings of flowers," Tallman says.

Many styles of commercial hummingbird feeders are available. The feeders most attractive have some red color located on them and incorporate perches. Although you can buy nectar, a much cheaper and equally nutritious mixture can be made by mixing one part white table sugar with four parts boiling water. Make sure all of the sugar is

Speed & Depth Determine Selections

"The basic strategy of fishing is to present a lure at the right depth and at the right speed in order to trigger a bite." The question always arises how do I pick the right lure or crank bait for the current conditions. One thing I try to always do is examine the 4 key factors that affect the bass. The four key factors being weather conditions, water temperature, clarity and the depth of active fish. You see cold warm and warm water presents different obstacles for a bass and in order to get a bite you must understand how it affects the fish. In cold water bass have a tendency to like crank baits with a tight-wiggle where in warm water they seem to respond to baits with a wide wiggle. Water clarity always affects color; stained water the bass respond better to bright colors where clear water forces you to match the water color more than any other time of year. Wind creates oxygen and pushes the bait around; both affect the bite and tell you where active fish might be located. It creates activity among the bass and fast moving baits like

spinner baits become good choices when it's windy. There are also times when fish activity is more related to the tops of structure, or to the bottom, this has a big effect on what you might use to fish that day. It might also affect the weight of your bait and whether you fish

deep or shallow or use a big trailer on a jig or a small one. Whether you might chose a fast dropping bait or a slow one, or a deep running crank bait or not. These factors all give you keys to the selection process and tell you what baits you need to be fishing with factors in mind.
