Gov. Justice also reminded anglers that the WVDNR stocked trout on the Elk River in Webster County in November as part of a pilot program to evaluate the economic impact of trout stocking in the area. The stocking occurred at the usual stocking locations and included 750 rainbow trout. A second stocking will take place later in December and include another 750 rainbow trout.

## Winter Jerkbait Fishing For Bass

A lot of people think a suspending jerkbait is just an early spring, prespawn lure. Nowadays, especially with forward-facing sonar, it's a year-round bait. Some of the best jerkbait days take place right now in December.

My favorite jerkbait is Booyah's new Flash Point. What separates it from other jerkbaits is an integrated gold or silver reflector in the head of the lure.

The Flash Point's reflector returns a strong sonar signal, which makes it easier to see on a forward-facing display. It also reflects light, which gives the bait a lating to schools of shad. little different flash and flair.

It comes with premium hooks, so don't you have to swap them out. And, it has a casting system that helps with distance and accuracy.

Jerkbaits shine for me in the wintertime because bass are in all stages. The bass can be shallow around docks and grass or suspended over 50 feet of water reBy Stetson Blaylick

When the water is in the mid to upper 50s. I start shallow and work my way deeper.

The bass may not be deep when the water is in the high 40s to low 50s, but they'll be suspended over deeper points, brushpiles and things of that nature.

When the water is above 50 degrees, you can retrieve it with a quick twitching cadence and short pauses.

You need to slow down when the water drops below 50 degrees. The bass are not as lethargic as most people think in cold water. They can still move quickly, but the shad do slow down. I slow my retrieve to mimic the natural sluggish motion of a shad in cold water. Instead of erratic twitches, I almost pull the bait and let it sit for two to three seconds or longer.

Bass in cold water swim toward your bait slowly. You can see that on Lowrance Active Target. It's critical that you give them enough time to react to your jerkbait. Getting deeper

When the bass are 15 to 25 feet deep, you need to get the bait down 10 to 15 feet so they can see it.

I do that by taping lead strips in front of the forward hook hanger. Another option is wrapping lead wire around the hooks.

The Flash Point suspends perfectly out of the package. It doesn't take much weight to make it sink slowly like a shad dying in winter. colors. That lets me adjust to the

I carry jerkbaits in a variety of weather, the water clarity and the mood of the bass.

Sometimes I find what the bass prefer by trial and error. They rarely want the same color pattern two days in a row.

In clear water on a bright, sunny day, I'll start with a natural shad coloration. If the bass are 15 to 25 feet deep, I'll opt for a bright white color.

In cloudy conditions, I like bright white and chartreuse colors. I also like white in dirty water. Shad turn more of a white, pale color in dirty water, no matter if it's sunny or cloudy.

## **Minerals For Antler Growth**

As gamekeepers, one of the first chores on your list for the spring and summer is to refresh your mineral sites. Overall use of minerals for antler growth usually tapers off when the acorns begin to fall and antlers harden, and it generally picks up again intensely when the turkeys start to gobble in the spring and antler genesis begins again. These times obviously coincide with antler genesis and when they harden during the

As gamekeepers, one of the first late summer/early fall and then hores on your list for the spring begin to grow again during the nd summer is to refresh your late winter.

Deer need both protein and minerals to grow their antlers. This is in contrast to animals with horns that are made of keratin (like fingernails), that do not shed, and need only protein to increase the growth their horns. Appreciate too, that whitetails must grow a new set of antlers every year, while animals that have horns only need to add gradually to their existing growth.

There have been countless studies conducted to determine whether mineral supplementation leads to any measurable increase in antler growth in whitetails most of them come back showing little to no measurable difference



or are inconclusive. The three foot "craters" in the ground created by whitetails lead most of us to believe there is more to a mineral site than just an attraction to the sodium generally found in most products, both natural and manmade. So do mineral supplements

the effects of mineral levels on antler size have not been scientifically documented, calcium and phosphorus levels are known to be important to antler development.

The exact amount of each nutrient can vary by region and by which study you happen to quote, but velvet antlers are made up roughly of 80-percent crude protein, 22-percent calcium, and 11-percent phosphorus. Hard antlers are closer to 40-percent crude protein, 25 to 35-percent calcium and about 18-percent phosphorus. There is no question that a good protein-rich food plot will do more for antler growth than a mineral site, but minerals do have an impact.

the essential nutrients and trace minerals they could need during these critical stages of growth and development.

As far as whether or not the mineral works, much depends upon the make-up of the specific mineral product and the science and technology behind it. Yes, mineral supplements work, but how well each performs varies product to product.

So even if a mineral supplement didn't have anything to do with antler growth, these ingredients help your whitetails take the forage they're consuming and turn it into antler, energy and protein rich milk for newborns.

A buck in velvet is exceedingly protective of his antlers. Bucks will not spar when still in velvet, and if provoked they will rise to strike with their hooves instead, which are every bit as deadly. If you watch a buck in velvet slipping through the brush you will see him delicately twist and turn to avoid scraping his antlers.

spring green-up is a huge part of a deer's diet. This new growth is very high in water and potassium content and causes deer to operate on a somewhat deficient level of sodium (salt). This constant flushing of a whitetail's system from the increased intake of green forage causes them to seek out areas with high sodium content and makes a readily available mineral source that contains everything their bodies need all the more vital.

I think maybe the easiest way to explain the positive benefits of mineral supplementation for your deer herd is to look at it as if it might pertain to humans. It is well documented and prov-

safety, providing minerals is just another tool for you to utilize for an overall healthier herd.

During the velvet or growing stages, antlers are comprised of around 80-percent proteins and the remaining 20-percent mostly macro minerals, chiefly phosphorous and calcium.

It only makes sense that if we are going to plant food plots and improve native browse to increase the protein percentage in their diet, we should also provide our deer with a mineral supplement

that mimics their antler make-up and skeletal needs. Chelated and organic minerals are more efficiently absorbed through the use of high quality yeast to improve rumen function. e.

By improving digestibility and retention of protein and minerals, more key nutrients are available for antler growth and body health. Directions for using are pretty straightforward. Typically heavier soil is better than sand and a shaded area is better than full sun. Clear the ground of debris and dig a small trench 3-6 inches deep and around 2 feet in length, pour in the minerals and blend with dirt that was removed.

These mineral sites should ideally be established during the late winter before spring green up, but can be applied anytime. Your deer will use it when they need it.

There are rare cases where a buck does not shed his antlers, and instead keeps a velvet-covered rack that continually grows throughout the year. The condition is referred to as cryptorchidism. These "cactus bucks" are usually the result

of an injury or castration of the testes which alters their testosterone levels. An older-aged buck that has a testes injury or castration while he is hard antler will likely shed his antlers early due to the sharp decrease in testosterone production. The following season the buck can grow a rack that is permanent and stays velvet-covered.

#### Snowshoe Hares In WV

In the quiet, snowy forests of West Virginia, the elusive snowshoe hare can be found hopping across the landscape. Known for their white seasonal coat and oversized feet, this remarkable small game species plays an important role in our state's high-elevation ecosystems. However, little is known about their population here. That's why WVDNR biologists and researchers at West Virginia University have teamed up to shine a light on this secretive species.

## THE UNIQUE TRAITS OF SNOWSHOE HARES

Studying the unique characteristics and behaviors of snowshoe hares is the first step in understanding their story. Snowshoe hares are uniquely adapted to high-elevation habitats, their which helps them stay warm and evade predators in the winter. These creatures have a seasonal white coat and large, fur-covered hind feet that help them move across snowy terrain. They inhabit forested spruce areas with dense understory vegetation like rhodo-

dendron thickets, relying on these for cover instead of burrows. Their nocturnal diet shifts with the seasons, ranging from green leaves and berries in summer to twigs and buds in winter.

Snowshoe hares play a vital role

in their ecosystem as both a prey species and a habitat indicator. They support predator populations, including bobcats, foxes, and birds of prey, and help shape plant communities by feeding on

vegetation, which promotes forest regeneration. Tracking their populations provides insights into the health of high-elevation ecosystems, as changes in hare numbers can indicate shifts in habitat conditions or broader environmental changes.

#### A LEGACY OF CONSERVA-TION

Snowshoe hares are native to West Virginia, inhabiting the southernmost extent of their range. Conservation efforts began as early as 1949 when hares were

ing was a normal practice by natural resource agencies in the early 20th century. The West Virginia Wildlife Center was established to support that practice so such restocking wasn't unique for snowshoe hares and other game species such as quail, turkey, and deer. By the mid-20th century, a shift to focusing on protection and enhance-

#### SIGHTS

Since January 2023, researchers have employed innovative methods to learn more about snowshoe hares. By analyzing fecal pellets collected from historic habitats throughout the year, scientists can estimate hare populations using genetic markers. These genetic signatures reveal individual hares, giving a clearer picture of their numbers and locations. Habitat data was also collected from many locations during a variety of seasons. This data helps researchers better understand the availability of resources and any effects of change to the understory. Combined, these techniques offer continue to page 20

an in-depth look at the species' distribution, genetics and habitat preferences.

Understanding the basic population trends of a culturally significant small game species, like hares, is crucial when tackling broader challenges such as climate change and disease outbreaks. One such concern is Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus serotype type 2 (RHDV-2), a highly contagious virus that affects both wild and domestic

affects both wild and domestic rabbits.While lab studies suggest hares might be less vulnerable to this disease compared to cottontails, this hasn't been studied in wild populations. RHDV-2 was first identified in U.S. domestic rabbits in 2018 and in wild rabbits in the southwestern U.S. by 2020. Although the virus hasn't been found in West Virginia, stepping up disease monitoring could help detect it early and guide effective management strategies.

Population density studies are also essential because they show how animals use their habitat and how available resources meet their needs. This information



helps wildlife managers create and improve young forest habitats, which benefit hares and other game species. Additionally, knowing where these animals live helps managers anticipate how they might react to future climate changes, ensuring better longterm conservation strategies. You might know French Creek Freddie as West Virginia's most popular weather-predicting groundhog, but do you know the story of how Freddie started forecasting or how he got his name? Get ready for the Groundhog Day celebration at the West Virginia State Wildlife Center on Feb. 2 by checking out these interesting facts about Freddie.

West Virginia's French Creek Freddie didn't come onto the scene until more than a century later. In 1978, Freddie's weather-predicting career started when former West Virginia State Wildlife Center Superintendent Bill Vanscoy responded to a reporter on Groundhog Day if there was a groundhog on site and if it had seen its shadow.

"I don't remember what I told him, but it was whatever was appropriate to the weather we were having. Anyway, he asked me what the groundhog's name was. I don't know what possessed me to do it but I skipped the usual lecture on why we don't name animals and said his name was French Creek Freddie. It went out on The Associated Press wire and soon we were getting calls from all over the county. Every year now, people from newspapers and TV stations come out on Groundhog Day and we kick a groundhog out of its den for the cameras.

#### FRENCH CREEK FREDDIE'S **PREDICTIONS ARE 50-50**

In the past 40 years, Freddie's forecasts have an accuracy rate of about 50 percent. On Groundhog Day 2024, the weather was cold, cloudy and snowy. So, Freddie did not see his shadow when he emerged from his den and predict-

ed an early spring. While the average daily high in February 2024 was 39 degrees, the temperature didn't warm up until May. The average daily temperature was 46 degrees in March and 54 degrees in April.

Freddie also has the help of the National Weather Service, which has an official weather observation station at the West Virginia State Wildlife Center. The NWS has high-tech instruments to measure rain or snow and temperature recordings in the area, which are recorded and submitted daily by wildlife center staff.

#### FUN FACTS ABOUT GROUND-HOGS

Groundhogs, also known as woodchucks or whistle-pigs, are the largest animal in the squirrel family. They whistle when alarmed and in the spring when they begin courting. Groundhogs continue to the next page



have short ears, a short tail and short legs, but are surprisingly quick. And their jaws are exceptionally strong. Their teeth never stop growing. Groundhogs eat grass, berries, vegetables, grasshoppers, insects and snails.

Groundhogs are one of the few animals that truly hibernate, a deep sleep or coma-like state where an animal's body temperature drops to a few degrees above freezing and their heart and breathing nearly stops.

Groundhogs are excellent swimmers, tree climbers and burrowers. They can move more than 700 pounds of dirt when digging a burrow or den used for sleeping, hibernating and caring for cubs. Young groundhogs are usually born in mid-April or May. By July they can go out on their own. The size of the typical groundhog litter is four to nine.

## **2024 Buck Season Results**

of Natural Resources (WVDNR) today announced preliminary harvest numbers for the state's buck Hancock, Hampshire, Jackson, firearms season.

According to preliminary data, collected through the WVDNR's electronic game check system, hunters in West Virginia harvested 41,090 antlered deer during the state's two-week buck firearms season, which ran from Nov. 25 to Dec. 8. The 2024 total harvest is slightly below the five-year average of 43,143.

The top 10 counties for the 2024 buck harvest were Greenbrier (1,742), Randolph (1,564), Preston (1,557), Pendleton (1,317), Jackson (1,277),Pocahontas (1,259), Ritchie (1,219), Hampshire (1,218), Hardy (1,178) and

The season is open statewide in all 55 counties. ## **2024 Fall Turkey Hunting Results**

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.VA. compared to 967 birds in 2023. — The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (WVDNR) announced today that hunters harvested 17 percent more fall turkeys in 2024 compared to last year.

"West Virginia is truly a top destination for turkey hunting, and our thriving turkey populations are a testament to the success of sustainable wildlife management," said WVDNR Director Brett Mc-Million. "These efforts ensure that hunters, whether seasoned or just starting out, can continue to enjoy abundant opportunities for years to come. We encourage everyone to experience the incredible hunting opportunities our state has to offer by purchasing a 2025 license and planning a trip in the new year."

According to preliminary hunting data from the WVDNR's electronic licensing and game checking system, fall turkey hunters harvested 1,130 birds in 2024 The fall 2024 harvest was also 17 percent above the five-year average (968 birds) and similar to the 10-year average (1,132 birds). Although fewer counties have a two-week season this year due to a lower spring harvest, the fall harvest was consistent with longterm averages.

current year's brood production and mast conditions. This year's brood survey results were 4.5 percent above last year's and 5.1 percent above the five-year average, indicating that the 2024 harvest might be slightly above last year's harvest.

Five out of six districts reported increased fall turkey harvest compared to last year. District 3 had the highest harvest with 289 birds, followed by District 1 with 191, District 4 with 180, District 2 with 169, District 5 with 160 and District 6 with 141.

Counties with the most harvests were Randolph County (77), Nicholas (66), Greenbrier (57), Pocahontas (53) and Mason (41). All of these counties except Mason County had a four-week season.

All hunters 15 and older are required to have a valid West Virginia hunting license and valid form of identification while hunting, which can be purchased at license agents across the state or online.
