Small Game & Trapping Opens

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.Va. — The West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (WVDNR) today announced that hunting and trapping seasons for several small game and fur-bearing species are set to open in West Virginia on Nov. 2.

"West Virginia has a hunting season for everyone and our trapping opportunities just add to the number of options folks have for enjoying outdoor adventures in the fall and winter," said WVDNR Director Brett McMillion. "These seasons also provide an excellent chance for experienced hunters to share their knowledge, so we encourage everyone to invite a new

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.Va. hunter along for the adventure."

Small game hunting is allowed during West Virginia's deer seasons, except for the first three days of buck firearms season, when trapping fur-bearing animals is permitted. Hunters should note that during buck season, No. 4 shot or smaller and slugs can only be carried if the hunter is also legally hunting deer or bear. Legal firearms for small game hunting include combination rifle-shotgun (over-under, etc.). It is illegal to hunt with any centerfire rifle, rimfire larger than .22 caliber or air rifles other than .22 caliber. Additionally, shot larger than

No. 4 or solid ball ammunition is prohibited in counties not open to buck firearms season.

Trapping Regulations

Trappers harvesting beaver, bobcat, fisher and otter must electronically check their catches within 30 days after the close of the respective season. A WVDNR-issued game check confirmation number shall be recorded in writing with the trapper's name and address and shall be attached and remain attached to each pelt or whole animal until sold, tanned, processed into commercial fur or mounted.

Trappers must also obtain a Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) seal for each bobcat and otter pelt harvested in West Virginia. Federal law requires this seal on all bobcat and otter pelts shipped to international markets. Trappers may obtain a CITES seal from the Elkins Operations Center or their local WVDNR district office. Contact information is available at WVdnr.gov/contact.

United States Hunting Statistics

What Percentage Of United States Citizens Participate In The Sport Of Hunting?

Since 2020, there have been over 15 million hunting-license holders in the US. However, because hunters sometimes purchase licenses in multiple states while other hunters, such as children, may not need licenses this number doesn't tell the whole story.

In 2021, Statista found that 25.87 million Americans aged six and older participated in some type of hunting activity. There were 309 million Americans in that age group overall, meaning that about 8.4 percent of US citizens participate in the sport of hunting. Is Hunting Participation Growing Or Shrinking And Why?

You may see hunters tout the fact 180 million, meaning about 7.7 that hunting license sales numbers have been increasing for nearly a decade, reaching 15.2 million in 2021 up 8.6 percent from 14 million in 1960. However, this is actually quite misleading for several reasons.

First, although the number of paid license holders has been increasing since about 2010, it had been in freefall since its peak of 16.2 million in 1982. In other words, despite the recent rise, numbers are still lower than they were 40 years ago when the population was much smaller.

Plus, speaking of population, it's grown much faster than the number of paid license holders. The US population in 1960 was

Indeed, the around their hunt. numbers show that the number of Americans aged six and older participating in hunting has decreased slightly each year since 2017. Over the five-year period from 2017-2021, hunting participation dropped from 27.62 to 25.87 million.

Why Is It Shrinking?

The biggest reason is that Americans have been moving to the cities over the last 50 years[4]. In 1960, only 70 percent of Americans lived in the city. By 2021, that number was 82 percent.

Although urban dwellers can certainly still go hunting, it's a lot more difficult. Those in the country may be able to hunt right in their own backyard while those in the city probably have to drive

tivities in the city. Indeed, the US Fish & Wildlife Service found that 13 percent of rural residents participated in hunting versus just three percent of urban residents.

Remember how the number of paid license holders has been increasing? Ironically, that may be the very reason overall hunter participation is dropping.

Many states have increased license costs. More importantly, they've made licensing schemes excessively complicated. You may need a certain license, various permits, different tags, all of which cost money and may require applications and lotteries.

This all represents costs and hassles that deter people from hunting.

The Myth of Cultural Changes

Many claim, and it's easy to believe, that the decrease in hunter participation is merely due to changing values in the United States. The idea is that people aren't as interested in hunting as they used to be, the same way people aren't as interested in quilting.

However, a little research shows this isn't true. For one thing, if interest in hunting were declining, there would be more hunters in older generations than younger. Yet the average age of an American hunter is 43.5, barely older than the overall average age of 38.

Moreover, research by the National Shooting Sports Foundation has actually found that interest in and approval for hunting has been increasing. For instance, 80 percent of Americans currently approve of legal hunting versus 73 percent in 1995.

This all suggests that it's the barriers of geography and regulation that keep people from hunting, not their lack of interest.

What Methods Of Hunting Are Most Popular?

The most popular hunting method is generally considered to be the rifle. When it comes to firearms, research shows 11 million hunters used rifles in 2020 versus 7.9 million for shotguns and only three million for handguns.

Statistics from the National Deer Association on deer harvest produce similar results for the 2020 season. Most successful kills were with firearms, usually a rifle. What Game Animals Are the Most Popular to Hunt?

Big game represents the most popular segment of animals to be hunted in the U.S..

Deer is by far the most popular game animal in the United States. Hunters spent an average of 14 days in 2016 hunting deer, more than any other animal, or over 57 percent of all hunting days. Rabbit was the next most frequently hunted animal at about 10 percent followed by wild turkey at less than seven percent.

How Many Jobs Are Supported By The Hunting Industry?

Hunting supports many different types of employment from out-



fitter clerks and salesmen to park rangers and guides. Research by Statista has determined that there are about 15,550 employees in the hunting and trapping sector in the US. That number has been fairly stable over the last decade or so, and the industry is expected to add a few hundred jobs through cotinue to the next page

Additionally, it can be difficult to define exactly what a "hunting job" is, but the activity of hunting creates economic activity and growth throughout various sectors. Consider that Cabela's alone employs over 19,000 people. Although many of them are accountants at the corporate office or spend as much time selling kayaks as crossbows, hunting nevertheless supports much of their livelihood.

As a result, the Association of Fish and Wildlife estimates[13] hunting supports that over 525,000 jobs in the US in one way or another. This equates to \$21.5 billion in salaries and wages each year in economic impact. Gender

Hunting has long been viewed as a male-dominated activity. For the most part, this impression is

accurate. As of 2019, roughly nine in 10 American hunters are men. Men also have a participation rate of eight percent versus just one percent for women.

However, studies have found Race that this number varies a lot by location. States and regions with easier access to hunting and elab-

orate cultures around it often have far more female hunters. In Wyoming, for example, 22 percent of hunters are female, more than one in five.

American hunters are predominantly white. The most extensive survey that looked at hunter race was the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Ser-

vice's National Survey of Fishing, Hunting, and Wildlife-Associated Recreation published in 2016. They surveyed over 250,000 people and found that of the over 11,000 that participated in hunting that year, less than 10 were black or Asian. 97 percent were white with two percent representing "other" races, likely Native American.

Hispanics as a cultural group also hunted less than non-Hispanics. While Hispanics are roughly 17 percent of the US population, they represent only three percent of hunters and have a hunter participation rate of just one percent. Age

There is a widespread myth that hunters tend to be older or that the

hunting population is aging. This simply isn't the case. Despite being the largest age group, seniors aged 65 and older had the lowest hunter participation rate overall at just three percent.

Hunting By Age Statistics

The ages that hunt the most relative to their proportion of the survey and therefore the US population are those 45-64, or the middle aged.

Hunting Statistics By State

Next, we look at hunting statistics by state as reported by state wildlife agencies.

Texas boasts the country's largest hunting population at over a million hunters. However, Texas is one of the largest states, both by area and population, so this isn't surprising. What we find more interesting is the hunter participa-

tion rate, or the number of people in each state who are hunters.

The info displays both hunter participation by state, for which South Dakota leads with 24 percent, and the total number of hunters.How Much Do Hunters Spend In The United States And What Do They Spend It On?

Hunters have a huge economic impact, both federally and at the state level.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service also found in their 2016 survey that hunters spent over \$26 billion that year on hunting, or \$2,287 per hunter. This includes everything from the food on hunting trips to hunting licenses to hunting magazines.

Equipment is nearly half of all hunting spending in the US, and hunting-specific equipment, such as rifles, bows and sights, is the



largest category overall, even more than vehicles and land, purchases with hefty price tags.

In fact, that works out to over \$7 billion on those items alone. And since we were curious how that broke down, we know you are too.

Research by the Association of Fish & Wildlife Agencies found that hunting generates \$5.3 billion in federal tax revenue as well as \$3.4 billion in state and local tax revenue for a total of \$8.7 billion each year. This breaks down to \$23.8 million per day.

How Is That Revenue Used By The Government?

ally used for wildlife conservation, wildlife research and hunter education. In fact, nearly all the money generated from the sale of licenses, permits and tags is used to fund state conservation agencies and maintain public lands. This alone provides \$1.8 billion for conservation efforts each year.

Additionally, the Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act of 1937, commonly known as the Pittman-Robertson Act, specifically directs tax revenue from hunting

equipment towards conservation. It levies an 11-percent excise tax on firearms, ammunition and archery equipment. Half of this money goes towards hunter education programs while the other half is used for wildlife conservation programs, including the acquisition of land for reserves and reintroduction of species.

Elk is the best example of this. Since 1937, elk have been reintroduced into eastern states where they'd gone extinct by 1937. Many of these states have even begun operating managed elk hunts.

Estimates suggest that hunters spend between \$3 and \$5 billion on equipment taxed by the Pittman-Robertson Act each year generating upwards of \$324 million annually. Since its inception, the act has distributed \$12 billion to its various programs.

Bowhunters spend over \$13 billion each year on hunting. In 2016, they spent \$1.6 billion on bows and arrows alone.

According to the 2016 survey from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, American hunters spend

Hunter Education For New Hunters SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.Va. — As opening dates for fall hunting seasons approach, the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources (WVDNR) is reminding new hunters who were born on or after Jan. 1, 1975, that they need to complete a certified hunter education class before they can purchase a hunting license.

"The WVDNR's hunter education class is an essential part of ensuring that all new hunters in West Virginia are equipped with the knowledge and skills needed to hunt safely, ethically and responsibly," said WVDNR Director Brett McMillion.

The two-day, 12-hour class is free and offered at various locations around the state. The class covers topics such as gun safety, wildlife management, ethics, survival, first aid, game identification and other need-to-know information. Once a hunter completes the class, they must also complete a hands-on firearm practical and pass a final exam under the supervision of a Natural Resources Police officer or volunteer hunter

education instructor to become fully certified in hunter education.

"Even if a hunter isn't required to take the hunter education class to purchase a hunting license in West Virginia, we encourage everyone to get their hunter education certification because it will allow them to hunt in other states that may have different hunter education requirements," said Natural Resources Police Colonel Bobby Cales.

Deer In The Rear View Mirror

I don't know about the rest of you deer hunters, but I can't remember how many times I have beensurprised by deer that suddenly appeared right under my treestand. Many times that has worked out better for the deer than for me. Murphy's Law is real. Whenever I spend most of my time watching one direction, I'm nearly always looking the wrong way.

These days, my old ears no lonsystem that worked when I was younger. Now, I must depend almost exclusively on my eyes to "see" all game animals. Unfortunately, a deer's eyesight features a much wider field of view than mine, it works better in ow light conditions and they can detect quick movement over 200 yards



By Bob Fisher, Wayne Co. ger provide the audible detection away. They have the visual advantage. On top of that, deer have better noses than bloodhounds. They can smell a hunter half a mile upwind.

One of the best pieces of deer hunting advice I was ever given was to look for "deer parts" instead of a whole deer. We often get our first glimpse of a head, leg, tail or even an ear twitching before we see the whole animal. When we watch deer that are moving normally, it's obvious "the stealth mode" is in their DNA. When they stop, they blend into the surrounding woods.

"deer radar" as we travel through the woods is to mimic deer behavior. One technique is to take one step. Use the time it would take for three more steps to slowly scan your surroundings. Then, take another step and repeat. A lot of the deer who see a hunters walking in a direction that does not approach them directly will be more curious than threatened. As long as you don't make prolonged eye contact, and they don't think you see them, many deer will just stand motionless and watch you move away from them.

Some deer will even follow a hunter to see what they're up to. Natural curiosity is one of the few whitetail weaknesses we can exploit. That's why calling, rattling, decoys and doe urine can often lure in a buck

One of the first deer hunts with my youngest son took place in the Monongahela National Forest. Late morning of opening day found us making a fast trip back to the truck. We desperately needed to warm up and put on more clothes - before we froze to death. Both of us stopped dead in our



tracks at the sound of a branch snapping 40 yards behind us. There stood a big buck, right in the

squirrel hunting fell down the totem pole of upland game acceptability. Doves, quail, grouse, rabbits, and ring-necked pheasants â€" a species not even native to this country â€" all command more admiration and respect from a genteel crowd than squirrels. That's a shame, because squirrels are perhaps the most abundant, accessible game animal in North America.

They're rodents, chased in the hills and hollers by hillbillies (as a fun aside, the gray squirrel is the state game animal of Kentucky). king at a topographic map or app. 2. Understand the Seasonal Rotation

Squirrels like mast in the fall, but it's not all ripe at the same time. Around here, they love pine cones in the late summer, but transition quickly to hickories through about the first of September. They'll eat beech nuts in early October if there's a crop of them, and after that, falling white oak acorns will bring an entire woods' worth of squirrels out of the treetops to forage on the ground, where they'll feed most of the winter.

3. Start High, Move Low

Hickory trees are the classic place to squirrel hunt in early fall, since one good shagbark or pignut (You did learn to identify those, right?) can draw multiple squirrels at a time. Squirrels feeding in these trees are noisy and fairly easy to locate â€" and you can scout good trees ahead of time simply by looking for cuttings at the base of the tree. When you're scouting for the first ripe hickories of the season, maybe for opening morning, look to the ridgetops first, since those trees seem to ripen just a few days earlier than the trees at lower elevation.

4. Hunt with Your Ears

Squirrels make particular noises, whether they're dropping golf ball-sized nuts out of the treetops, searching for acorns on the ground, or barking at a predator. Other critters such as blue jays and woodpeckers make similar noises" but they're not the same. Good squirrel hunters know they'll locate half or more of their game by hearing them first, and by recognizing what is indeed a squirrel and what is something else. With experience, you'll learn, too but you have to shut up and listen.

If I'm toting a shotgun, I'll pair it with a full choke or even a turkey tube to ensure a dense pattern and clean kill. Lately, I've seen several squirrel hunters use lightweight .410 turkey single-barrel guns topped with optics, and they're just ideal for the task.

12. Use Enough Shell

Save the light loads for the skeet range or dove field. It's worth splurging for heavier high brass game loads when squirrel hunting. From a 20-gauge, I like a full 1-ounce load of No. 6 lead, like FEDERAL'S HEAVY FIELD GAME LOAD. In my son's .410, 3-INCH. 11/16-OUNCE the LOAD OF 6S works well out to 30 yards" again, when paired with a tight choke. Assuming your gun patterns it well, larger No. 4 shot provides good terminal effect on squirrels without filling the edible quarters with lead.

13. Tote a .22

An accurate .22 rifle is the quint- LOWPOINT. essential squirrel gun, and using it effectively requires a step up in skill from using a shotgun. Open-sighted rifles work, particularly at close range, but a good scope allows for more precision shooting. A worthy squirrel rifle will put five shots into a quarter-sized group at 25 yards. Can it be called a squirrel rifle if it shoots wider than that? Meh, maybe you need more practice. Opinions vary on the best load for squirrels, but I prefer high-velocity hollowpoints such as the 36-GRAIN CCI MINI-MAG or **37-GRAIN WINCHESTER SU-**

Though I grew up hunting with a everything else is learning to find .22 and still frequently carry one today, my modern squirrel rifle of choice is actually a bull-barreled .17 HMR loaded with CCI'S 20-GRAIN FULL-METAL JACKET. With a muzzle velocity of almost 2,400 fps, the round has a flat-enough trajectory to hit a squirrel through the head to 100+ yards, and off-the-shelf .17s are, in my experience, incredibly accurate. The FMJ bullet keeps meat destruction to a minimum, though I still prefer head-shots. If you're using anything frangible (which, most .17 HMR bullets are polymer tipped or hollowpoint), head-shots are mandatory. CCI's 20-grain FMJ is an excel-

lent .17 HMR squirrel load. CCI's 20-grain FMJ is an excel-

One lesson from squirrel hunting that's applicable to hunting make-shift gun rests in the field. Not many people can consistently hit squirrels in the head with a rifle, off-hand. Taking a post off a tree, and using your hand to buffer the forend from the bark, is about as solid as it gets in the woods, and it's fast. Right-handed shooters need to use the left side of the tree when possible.

16. Carry Sticks

Sometimes, there's not a good rest tree growing exactly where you need it. In that case, a set of shooting sticks (I like Primos Trigger Sticks) is pretty handy. They make for a decent walking staff the rest of the time, too.

Hunting with a rimfire teaches you to find a solid rest in the field, no matter what.

squirrels almost always try to hide). As you circle the tree for a shot, they will circle in turn, using the tree trunk to obscure themselves from your view. When you're hunting alone, this can make it difficult to get a shot. I've thrown limbs to the opposite side of the tree and even tied ropes to saplings and shaken them, with mixed results. But if you're hunting with a buddy, one of you can almost always circle the tree and push the squirrel around for a better shot. The squirrel will move away from the person who's moving, so the shooter should find a good opening and steady rest â€" and be ready to shoot soon as the buddy makes the circle. When pressed, gray squirrels will frequently jump tree and run.

19. Hunt Over a Dog

I'll fully confess to not being



BIRCH RIVER, WV 304-649-2607 a dog guy. I don't have the patience to be a trainer, and I prefer to sneak up on squirrels for a shot. That said, hunting with dogs is fun, and most serious squirrel doggers are eager to introduce people to the sport â€" particularly if you know of a good place to let them run their dogs. Squirrel dogging is at its best in the late season because squirrels are foraging on the ground, where dogs can both see and smell them, and because the barren trees make it easier to locate them for a shot. If you've got designs on trying it, stockpile a few places to go for a winter hunt, and then don't be shy about asking.

20. Take a Kid

Even under the best of circumstances, deer and turkey hunting involve a lot more boring moments than exciting ones. With squirrel hunting, you can stay on the move, and your kid can kick mushrooms and play in the creek in between stops. Yet, squirrels are surprisingly wary, so a kid learns fast to shut his mouth and keep still, too, if he wants fried squirrel and ketchup for dinner.

It's all a wonderful lesson. Speaking of dinner, if you only bag one squirrel with your kid by your side, remember that it's still worthy of a feast. Take it home, cook it up, and celebrate properly. 21. Skin Clean

There are plenty of ways to skin a squirrel, and you should learn a couple to see what works best for you. Regardless, show up to the cleaning station prepared to do a clean job. I like a slick 2x8, upon which to set my skinned squirrels as I work, and running water available if possible. Soon as the skin is off, get it and the tails away from the meat, and rinse the meat frequently as you work. Squirrel hair belongs on fishing lures, not the dinner table.

22. Bring Shears

The handiest squirrel-cleaning tool ever made is a pair of heavy-duty game shears or utility scissors. I buy a new set from continue to page 34

the hardware store every couple seasons. They work to snip off squirrel feet, and cut right through bones. A properly cleaned squirrel should render two front legs, two hind legs, and the saddle, which is the middle of the back (bone-in) with two backstraps attached.

23. Age a Squirrel

The time-honored way to age a big male squirrel is by looking at the balls, which are perhaps proportionately larger than those of any other creature on Earth. If you couldn't show them to your mother without blushing, that squirrel is likely to be tough. Save him for the stew pot and slow cooking. Young squirrels are better for frying.

24. Make a Hanger Tote

Get a wire coat hanger and snip it apart on both the top and bottom. The wire should be about 7 inches long on the top and bottom when you're done, and shaped into a rough V. Curl a hook into the top wire with pliers, so that you can loop it around the bottom wire,

and clip it on and off. Thread the bottom wire through a dead squirrel's rear-leg tendons, and you've got a perfect squirrel tote that will hang securely from a belt loop or pack.

25. Scout from Your Stand

One for the deer hunters: Ever seen a squirrel from your stand? I have. Sometimes, hillbillies need a break from being scentfree, low-impact, and generally

GROVE, Okla. — When Blake Capps was in first grade, he and his classmates were asked to write down what they wanted to be when they grew up. The scraps of paper then went into a time capsule that was opened a dozen years later when they were high school seniors.

"I wrote that I wanted to be a professional fisherman," Capps said.

After winning the 2024 Mercury B.A.S.S. Nation Championship presented by Lowrance, Capps can officially say his wish has come true.

The 28-year-old Capps weighed a three-day total of 42 pounds, 14 ounces to win the championship that concluded Friday on Grand Lake O' The Cherokees, less than 100 miles from his home in continue to the next page

The victory at Grand Lake comes with a wealth of riches, among them a spot in the 2025 Bass Pro Shops Bassmaster Classic which will be held March 21-23 on Lake Ray Roberts in Fort Worth, Texas. Capps also collected \$50,000 cash, an invitation to compete in the 2025 Bassmaster Elite Series, and a Nation's Best boat and truck combo to use for the year.

After hoisting the Bryan V. Ker-

Nation Champion each year, Capps (who works as a petroleum operator at a nearby power plant) reflected upon the time capsule that was cracked open back in 2015.

"I haven't had a chance to do a lot of competitive fishing because of work and the cost that goes with being a tournament fisherman," he said. "But I'm definitely gonna have to sit down and think about (accepting the offer to fish in the Elite Series).

"And I can tell you, I'm leaning really heavy toward it," he said, chuckling. "I may go out there and get my butt whooped. But somewhere down the road I can look back and say I was a Bassmaster Elite one day. It'll be almost impossible to pass up this chance."

Living close to one of America's premier bass fisheries didn't hurt Capps' chances on Grand Lake, but he noted he's never fished the reservoir at this time of year. With temperatures warmer than usual, though, he figured bigger bass would be feeding in shallow water. They were, but the bites were scarce enough that each one was precious.

"I don't know if anyone covered as much water as I did this week," he said. "I ran constantly, and it was all for five, six, seven bites a day. It was work, but it paid off."
